Zigzag track update: Significant progress has been made on the Zig Zag Track upgrade, with major improvements enhancing accessibility and safety for all users. Work completed to date includes extensive earthworks and the repaving of the track with exposed aggregate concrete, providing a more durable and user-friendly surface. An exposed aggregate nib wall has been formed and poured, featuring recessed path lights to improve nighttime visibility. Additionally, a new handrail has been installed. Looking ahead, the next phase of the project will see the installation of two new lamp posts, arriving late may. The construction of a gabion basket wall and park bench at the layby area and the addition of rusticated panels to the handrail, with an estimated completion date of June.
