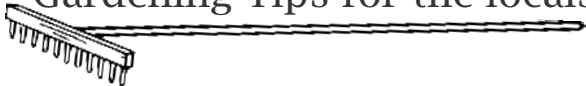

DIG IT !

Gardening Tips for the locals



Welcome to our fortnightly garden section. We hope the tips are helpful and make a difference in your garden!

Happy Gardening !

The Spring garden is just a wonderful time - with a great array of plants and bulbs. Narcissus - a hugh family. Match-heads, Fritillaria, Alpines, Trilliums, Erythroniums, Primulas, Tulips. All large and miniture varieties. Too numerous to list. So keep your eye open for them. A lovely hardy and showy plant flowering now are the Primulas - clump forming, single and double flowering. P.denticulata - blue shadings to magenta are beautiful with a pompom head on a stem - let it seed. All primulas love it moistish with some shade. A "must have" primula just through the leafmould now is Primula sieboldii, (Snowflake) cerise, pink, blue, white and matt forming with rings of flowers on low stems - Different to the P Candalaba which is a couple of feet tall and also very beautiful but a bit more touchy to grow. Prunus trees, Cherry - Malus Crab apple - Viburnum highly scented shrubs - a huge range to choose from. The white cherry trees flowering now in the Hospital garden in Mt Fuji. Birds dig holes in the soil/mulch at this time of the year after worms for their young - and they can do a lot of damage and make a mess - however if you spread the soil back (each morning!!) they wont come back to that spot. A wee tip. Enjoy your garden - its yours.

After-Hours Service

FOR WHEN TUAPEKA COMMUNITY HEALTH (TCH) MEDICAL CENTRE IS CLOSED



THC On-Call Nurse Hours

5:30pm to 10:00pm weekdays and 10:00am to 10:00pm weekends and public holidays. To access this service, you must call 485 9050 and be triaged by Ka Ora Telecare. **You cannot call the TCH On-Call Nurse directly.**

Ka Ora Fees (paid directly to Ka Ora)

There is no charge for the Ka Ora Nurse assessment or advice. Adults over 65 and Community Services Cardholders will be charged \$19.50 for a Ka Ora GP consult. All others (aged 14-64 years) will be charged \$79 (if the call is before 10pm or \$99 (if the call is after 10pm). There is no charge for the Ka Ora GP for children under 14 years.

TCH On-Call Nurse Fees

You will be charged \$50 (or \$19.50 if you are a Community Services Cardholder), if you are seen by the TCH On-Call Nurse at the medical centre. Under 14 years will be free of charge. If your injury is ACC related you will be charged \$30.

Tuapeka Community Health no longer has a memorandum of understanding with Clutha Health First (CHF). If TCH enrolled patients present at CHF, they may be seen as casual patients (this incurs a higher cost) if CHF is able to see them (there are no guarantees of this).

We encourage our patients to follow the flowchart above when they need to access after-hours care.
